UPDATE - SEPTEMBER 2022



On 8 September the Australian Parliament oversaw the historic passing of new Climate Change Legislation. Australia has made a commitment to listen: to our regional partners and to learn from the experiences of others. We recognise that climate change is not an abstract threat, but an existential one.

The Climate Change Legislation is the foundation upon which Australia's climate policies rest. It will enshrine in law the nation's commitment to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 43 per cent below 2005 levels by 2030, and net zero by 2050. It provides a framework to accelerate investment in renewable energy, transmission, and storage.

Passing this legislation is a step forward towards achieving our shared aspirations. We will work together with the region to build a resilient, clean energy sector and unlock green trade and investment opportunities—because our partners recognise that climate change is not only a challenge we need to address together, but presents opportunities for us to embrace.

Australian business is doing its part. For example, Australian company Sun Cable is progressing a project to construct a 4,200 kilometre undersea cable from Darwin to Singapore, to provide renewable electricity generated from what could be the world's largest solar farm in Australia's Northern Territory. This is the kind of ambition we will need to face up to the challenge of climate change and set the region up for a more prosperous future – powered by cleaner and cheaper energy.

Our Climate Change Legislation delivers a simple yet powerful message, at home and abroad. Australia is back.

AAS MEMBER SPOTLIGHT

LEE HAOMING, MANAGING DIRECTOR, HUGGS ALUMNUS OF ROYAL MELBOURNE INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY (RMIT)



As the Managing Director of Huggs, Haoming maps out the company's vision and spearheads its strategy and growth. He is responsible for levelling up the brand value exponentially and building a brand culture that focuses on Flavour, People and Doing Good.

Haoming joined Huggs at the start of COVID-19, in June 2020. Since then, he restructured the company's business model and direction, completed a full rebranding transformation, and secured over 5 million SGD in various capital investments and 12 new outlets across Singapore. Huggs has since grown to become Singapore's largest homegrown specialty coffee cafe chain to date, with close to 30 outlets (including the upcoming new outlets) found across the island, serving up to 400,000 cups per month.

As a proud local brand, Huggs is the only cafe chain that serves "East meets West" beverages, i.e. local Kopi to western Latte and even fusions like Latte Gula Melaka, making Huggs uniquely Singaporean. Haoming's introduction to Huggs has fuelled its rapid growth as he looks to launch Huggs Roastery, Bakery and Training Academy at its new headquarters in Jan 2022 to expand its B2B business arm. This is part of his expansion plan into regional markets and beyond. Before joining Huggs, Haoming co-founded the wildly popular Artbox Singapore which garnered over 700,000 visitors during the 6-day event. As the Regional Head of Strategy for Invade, he brought Artbox to Kuala Lumpur and brought Taiwan's Shilin Night Market to Singapore.

Due to the success of Artbox Singapore, Haoming was a recipient of Prestige 40 Under 40 in 2017. Besides his current role as the MD of Huggs, Haoming has a keen passion for youth development. This passion drives him to pledge as a mentor for youths with the Mentoring Alliance of Singapore. He is also the Strategic Advisor for Event Midas which is the organizer of this Esports event - Nexus Your Playground. Haoming is also a partner of a tuition centre. He hopes to create a positive impact for youths and students in what little ways he can. Academically, Haoming has a Bachelor's degree with triple majors in Banking and Finance, Accounting and Business Management from Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology (RMIT) Australia. Upon graduation, he was invited to be a member of the Golden Key International Honour Society.



A guide to procrastination and how to overcome it



Dr Alla Demutska shares a deep dive into procrastination, including how to identify and change the habit.

Imagine this: Your homework or assignments are piling up. You tell yourself that you'll get to them soon, when you're feeling more motivated, or you convince yourself that you perform better under pressure. Meanwhile, you find yourself putting off tasks and finding other things to do — from scrolling through TikTok to binge-watching yet another Netflix series.

If this sounds familiar, you're not alone. Procrastination (the act of delaying or postponing an action) is something many of us have been guilty of. According to some studies, approximately 75 per cent of students identify themselves as procrastinators, and 50 per cent of students identify themselves as chronic procrastinators (i.e., it happens a lot and causes significant problems for them).

Procrastination was shown to be related to:

- Poor academic performance
- Insomnia
- Deterioration on emotional well-being
- Lower quality of life
- Relationship issues
- Compromised immune system

Procrastination as a habit

The truth is, you are not born as a procrastinator. Dr Alla Demutska, Lecturer of Clinical Psychology at James Cook University in Singapore, shares, "Your family and life history play a role in the development of procrastination. For example, a harsh controlling family environment is often linked to the development of procrastination. Procrastination is a learned response, which means you can unlearn it. First, you need to understand why and how you use procrastination, and then learn how to change this habit."

She adds, "Procrastination is often linked to the unhelpful ways of regulating difficult emotions and states such as fear, anxiety, boredom or sadness. We distract ourselves by focusing on something else, for example, checking emails or cleaning the apartment. This momentary relief reinforces the procrastination cycle. While long-term we still have to face our emotions and also the consequences of our procrastination."

"When we feel anxious or insecure, our amygdala, 'the threat detector' part of our brain, perceives the task we are facing as a threat. The amygdala starts to hijack the brain and triggers a fight-or-flight response. This causes problems in our logical and analytical thinking and we have even greater difficulty prioritising things and organising our thoughts," Dr Demutska explains.

Change your procrastinating habit with mindfulness

Changing old habits can be hard, but not impossible. Dr Demutska offers some tips for identifying and changing the habit of procrastination:

- 1. Cultivate **curiosity**. Bring awareness to sensations in your body when you noticed the desire to procrastinate. What are you feeling right now? Where do you feel sensations in your body? Can you stay with your sensations and just observe them for some time without trying to distract yourself?
- 2. Have you noticed any **thoughts** that get in the way of you actually doing work? What happens when you identify with them Does this increase or decrease stress? Does it make it easier or harder to focus on the task in front of you? Practice **letting go** of these thoughts and returning your focus to the task at hand. Gently. Compassionately. **Without judgment**. Notice when your mind goes into 'auto-pilot' and gently bring your attention back. Keep practising patience and persistence!
- 3. Motivation comes after action. Just **get started**, do not wait for motivation. Commit to doing something, and once you have some momentum it will be much easier to keep going. Just **5 minutes** in front of your work with the intention to get started, noticing what gets in the way, will let you start to learn more about the habit of procrastination and be able to change it.
- 4. You can use a **weekly** and **yearly planner** so that you can see at a glance when things are due and anticipate busy periods while planning out your time in advance.
- 5. **Do not multitask**. Multitasking may lead to increased stress and reduced performance.
- 6. **Rewards** are important. When you completed some part of your work or spend sufficient time at the task at hand, do something pleasurable for yourself. Do it afterwards, not before you started the task. Allow yourself to enjoy the feeling of completing the task and the feeling you get from the reward.

While procrastination can have substantial negative impacts on a person's life, there are ways to address it and there is hope for those caught in a pattern of chronic procrastination. By effectively prioritising tasks, being mindful, and practicing self-compassion, we can start to overcome the problem and be one step closer to fulfilling our dreams and goals.

In addition, students at James Cook University in Singapore have the opportunity to attend a Mindfulness for Academic Success workshops. This six-week course aims to enhance students' well-being, reduce stress and improve study habits to foster a more productive and welcome academic experience. Students can follow James Cook University in Singapore on its social media channels to stay updated on when the latest Mindfulness for Academic Success workshops become available (as of this writing, the next round of workshops begin in November 2022).

Singapore campus of James Cook University receives significant art donation



A significant work of art is being donated to the Singapore campus of James Cook University to raise awareness on migration, identity and mental health.

The Singapore campus of James Cook University (JCU) has received the donation of an artwork — titled Rose Garden — created by Australia-based interdisciplinary artist Hiromi Tango. An event unveiling the donation took place on 31 August 2022 at the Singapore campus. The donation of artwork comes from Guy and Henny Scott, the parents of JCU, Singapore Psychology alumnus Maddy Scott who is now practicing in Melbourne. Guy Scott is also former President of AustCham.



The aim of the donation, which will be installed in the Psychology Clinic_of the Singapore campus, is to spark a meaningful dialogue on migration, identity and mental health amongst viewers.

In a statement, the artist Hiromi Tango says, "Rose Garden recalls a period in my life when I was trying very hard to be the perfect Australian wife and mother, caught between two worlds of my traditional upbringing in regional Japan, and things that seemed to signify a good woman in Australia."

"My hope is that women and girls from all backgrounds and cultures can feel free to realise their potential, unencumbered by the confines and expectations placed on women."

The renowned artist collaborated with Dr Emma Burrow of the Florey Institute for the launch of Hiromi Tango's

installations in the ArtScience Museum at Marina Bay, entitled 'MENTAL: Colours of Wellbeing'. The installation represents a 'living lab' that engages the public on mental health issues through art. This living lab artwork explores how fun, laughter and play can encourage the levels of physical activity needed to boost our mood and protect our mental health. Dr Emma Burrow was also present at the unveiling event at the Singapore campus of JCU.

JCU is committed to promoting and championing positive mental health, and the Psychology Clinic and the Clinical Psychology Team play an important role in supporting these efforts.

Dr Natasha Riard, Psychology Clinic Manager at JCU in Singapore, says, "The Psychology Clinic is a training facility for students completing the postgraduate professional course in clinical psychology at James Cook University, Singapore. The clinic provides services to JCU, Singapore students and the community for a variety of presenting concerns across the lifespan. We have active collaborations with hospitals such as KK Women's and Children's Hospital, as well as community providers such as MINDS and Bishan Home to help them with psychological services. Our fees are lower than most comparable clinical psychology services in Singapore and further reduced for those on minimal income."

Professor Chris Rudd OBE, Deputy Vice Chancellor and Head of Campus, Singapore at JCU, says, "The University is grateful for this valuable donation, and I look forward to the ways that this rich and beautiful artwork will add depth and perspective for visitors."
