Revolutionising food: Australia's protein industry leads the way in sustainability





Australia could capture an additional \$13 billion to produce new and improved products for all types of protein

Australian proteins have long been a staple of Singaporean households and in the food service industry with Aussie beef and lamb trusted as safe, nutritious and tasty. Recently chicken has been on the minds of many and we are pleased to see more Australian chicken making its way to Singapore – hopefully into your atas chicken rice!

Australia's Protein Roadmap released by CSIRO shows that the future of global food security will rely heavily on global access to proteins creating significant opportunity for agricultural, meat and livestock industries.

But did you know Australia also has a growing alternative protein industry?

Australia is home to several innovative startups that are leading the way in this space. From plant based protein to insect protein and lab grown meat, these companies are offering interesting, sustainable and healthy protein options.

One of the most prominent players in the Australian alternative protein scene is v2food. Backed by the Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation (CSIRO) Australia's national science agency and a Singaporean state owned investor, v2food has developed a process that uses legumes to create a protein that has a meat like texture and taste. With a strong focus on sustainability, v2food's mission is to create plant based foods that are not only healthy and tasty but also better for the planet.

Another player in the Australian alternative protein landscape is BuggyBix, an Australian pet food company that produces sustainable and healthy pet food products made from insect based protein. BuggyBix's products are made from black soldier fly larvae which are a sustainable and ecofriendly source of protein. BuggyBix has a strong focus on reducing food waste, using food waste such as fruit and vegetable scraps to produce its insect based protein.

Australians like Singaporeans love to makan and are super adventurous with food trends including going flexitarian! Alternative protein products are becoming more prevalent in mainstream supermarkets and food service companies in Australia.

In addition to these Australian companies, the recent announcement by the Singapore Food Agency (SFA) to approve the sale of 16 insect species as food in Singapore has garnered interest in the industry. Insects are a rich source of protein and have a low environmental footprint for production. Will consumers be open to insect based ingredients and products? We think so.

From plant based meats to insects protein, these innovative startups are creating delicious, sustainable and healthy options for both humans and pets.

Australia and Singapore continue to collaborate closely on increasing two way flows of business, science and research and we expect to see more in the alternative proteins sector as both countries focus on food security and sustainability goals.

Accenture and Lendlease Expand Partnership to Grow Podium Property Insights Platform











Accenture and Lendlease announced that they are expanding their partnership to further invest in developing Lendlease's industry-leading Podium Property Insights (PPI) platform. Using real-time data collected from sensors placed within building environments, PPI provides real estate managers with valuable insights to better understand how their workplaces are utilised and chart a course toward meeting their sustainability, cost and employee engagement goals.

In addition, Lendlease will now also extend the Podium platform into retail portfolios, with the introduction of a new augmented reality capability that creates immersive retail experiences for customers. The PPI platform will house the data that enables landlords and tenants to make informed data decisions, partnering together to increase foot traffic and dwell time through new offers and experiences within the digital/metaverse layers of their physical assets.

With the use of artificial intelligence, augmented reality and virtual reality, Accenture and Lendlease delivered an innovative experience in Lendlease's shopping malls in Singapore in celebration of Chinese New Year. The trial allowed customers to access in-store offers, digital tokens and NFTs, enabling retailers to blur the line between online and in-store experiences.

Over the course of the four-week trial, 10,000 wallets were created via a mobile app and 29,000 offers collected and viewed across 50 participating tenant stores. Accenture research has found that approximately two-thirds of both in-store and mobile shoppers believe that technologies and innovations improve their shopping experience.

While the pandemic has caused disruptions and set in place new trends across both workplace and retail, the collaboration between Accenture and Lendlease has allowed for the embracement and understanding of new trends.

There are 43 million people in the world who are blind and another 295 million are vision impaired.

9 out of 10 people who are blind or vision impaired don't need to be. Eye diseases such as cataract, diabetic retinopathy, trachoma, and refractive error are either treatable or preventable.







Our Approach and Impact

Over the past 31 years, we have restored sight to more than 3 million people around the world and supported programs to deliver more than 200 million doses of antibiotics for trachoma.

The Foundation is unique in its sustainable, long-term approach. We not only treat patients, but we also equip hospitals, train eye health teams and work with health authorities and other partners to empower local people to deliver local services. We are proud of our record of training future generations of eye doctors, building local eye health capacity, driving innovation, and advocating for the integration of eye health in national health systems

The Fred Hollows Foundation Singapore

31% of the world's blind reside in the Asia region. Despite a dramatic economic upturn in recent years, many people in the region are still living with blindness that is either treatable or preventable. The Foundation is active throughout the ASEAN region, and we expanded our operations to Singapore in late 2022 to reach the growing number of needlessly blind people in the region. Singapore is a major hub for the Southeast Asia region, so our Singapore office plays a pivotal role in supporting our fundraising and advocacy efforts as well as raising awareness about our sight-saving work.
